Swallows and Armenians 16:00-17:00, 9th and 10th July 2022

Adapted from the book by Karen Babayan, with source material from Arthur Ransome

Arthur Ransome's *Swallows and Amazons* is a classic book about children having adventures on a lake. The Walker family have always been depicted as quintessentially English in the book, film and TV adaptations of the story; but what is not widely known is that Ransome modelled his characters on the Altounyans, an Anglo-Armenian family from Aleppo, Syria. *Swallows and Armenians* reinstates the cultural diversity of the children who inspired Ransome, delving into the very special relationship between the two families that also, spectacularly fell apart.

This fascinating story of friendship and family, love and jealousy, with a good measure of sailing thrown in, has been brought to life by a multicultural cast whose own diverse backgrounds and family migration stories mirror that of the Altounyan children. This project reappraises a children's classic, uncovering and celebrating the ethnic richness of British culture.

Swallows and Armenians began life in 2017 as a small exhibition, and rapidly grew into a book of short stories, painstakingly researched through letters and diaries from the Arthur Ransome archive at the University of Leeds Special Collections. This was followed by a devised performance with local children at Theatre by the Lake, Keswick, an audiobook (available at www.audible.com) and a touring exhibition across the north of England.

We are thrilled to have been commissioned by Cumbria Opera Group to create the newest addition to the *Swallows and Armenians* catalogue. In collaboration with **Persia Babayan-Taylor**, a director, actor-musician and composer, *Swallows and Armenians* has been adapted for the stage by Karen Babayan under the mentoring of award-winning playwright Mick Yates.

We are also pleased to present **Shakeh Major Tchilingirian**, an acclaimed choreographer and performer based in London who has accompanied the Swallows and Armenians' exhibition tour with her project *The Circle of Life* community dance event.

Swallows and Armenians is supported by Lottery Funding from Arts Council England.





Karen Babayan (Author, Swallows and Armenians)

Born in Iran to Armenian/British parents, Karen moved to the UK due to the impending Islamic Revolution in 1979. Latterly she lived in Leeds, a stone's throw from the house in which Arthur Ransome was born. She now lives in Appleby, Cumbria. An established, multi-disciplinary artist, writer and curator, Babayan has exhibited nationally and Internationally with work in many public collections

including Special Collections, Brotherton Library, University of Leeds; Leeds City Art Gallery; Harris Art Gallery, Preston; Tate Britain Library, London; Museum of Modern Art, New York and Art Gallery of Ontario, Toronto. In 2016 she gained a PhD, published her first book of short stories 'Blood Oranges Dipped in Salt', and was awarded C-Art Cumbria Artist of the Year. www.karenbabayan.com



Persia Babayan-Taylor (Director, *Swallows and Armenians*)

Persia Babayan-Taylor was born in Leeds to English and Armenian-Iranian parents, and grew up in Cumbria on the doorstep of the Lake District.

Persia trained at Guildford School of Acting, graduating with a First Class Honours degree. Beginning a varied career in the performance industry, Persia has worked as an actor and

musician performing on screen and on stage in London's West End, as a composer creating music for theatre and short film, and as a producer and director.

Now working predominantly as a director, Persia has worked with notable venues and establishments such as Theatre by the Lake and Guildford School of Acting. In 2021 she produced and directed Actor-Musician theatre company Jupiter Theatre's regional tour of *Twelfth Night*, and directed Mozart's *Così Fan Tutte*, the flagship opera of the inaugural Cumbria Opera Festival.

In 2022 Persia produced Jupiter Theatre's second regional theatre tour. In 2023, Persia is thrilled to be making her directing debut in documentary film-making and television.



Madeleine Wilshire (Musical Director and Composition Editor, Swallows and Armenians)

Madeleine Wilshire is an actor, musician, composer and Musical Director who grew up in Cornwall, before training in Actor-Musicianship at the Guildford School of Acting.

Previous credits as a Musical Director include *Twelfth Night* (Jupiter Theatre), *The City* (Nicholson Upstage Theatre), *Cymbeline* (Jupiter Theatre), and *Goldilocks* (Guildford School of Acting). As a composer, previous credits include *Twelfth*

Night, The City, Cymbeline, Tales of Ice and Snow (Jupiter Theatre), and Indebted (short film).

David Haller (Arthur)



1. Verdi - 'La donna e mobile' from Rigoletto

The misogynist Duke of Mantua sings of his contempt for women, with little thought for the consequences of his actions.

2. Mozart - 'Dies Bildnis' from *Die Zauberflöte*

Tamino has just fallen in love with a picture of Pamina.

This portrait of magical beauty, Like never an eye seen before I can feel, how this godlike effigy Fills my heart with new motion

This certain something I can't really name Yet I can feel it burn like a fire

Could this sensation be love? Yes, none but love it must be..

O if I could but find her I wish that she already stood before me I'd be so pure and warm

What would I do?
I would with great delight
Press her against my bosom
And she'd be mine forevermore.

3. Gimenez - 'La tarántula es un bicho muy malo' from *La Tempranica*

Grabié sings a traditional folk-song to a hunting party.

The tarantula's an evil little critter You can't kill it with sticks or with stones

For it runs off and hides in corners And it's sting is wicked

Ay mother! I don't know what's up with me Only yesterday I went into the threshing barn And now I'm shaking all over. I must have been stung By the nasty tarantula And now I'm really ill. Their blood is so bad May the devils eat one another! To hell with the spider That on its stomach Has a painted guitar! Dancing is the only cure for this terrible pain. Ay! Curse the spider that stung me!

Hanna and Danilo finally declare their love for each other.

7. Bernstein - 'Tonight' from West Side Story

Maria and Tony plan a brighter future together,

8. Bizet - 'La fleur que tu m'avais jetée' from Carmen

Don José loves Carmen and is upset by her mockery of him.

The flower which you have thrown me, I kept with me inside my prison, Withered and dry, this flower, Hath always retained its sweet smell, And throughout the entire hours, I would close my eyes and sniff it, I would get drunk with this smell, And during the night, I had visions of you!

I began to curse you, To detest you, asking myself: "O why has destiny placed The flower upon my shirt?"

Since the day I gave myself my destiny seems all flower-strewn I think I'm dreaming under a fairy sky my soul still intoxicated by your first kiss! What a beautiful life! My dream wasn't a dream! Oh! I'm so happy! Love is spreading its wings over me! In the garden of my heart sings a new joy!

Everything is vibrant everything rejoices at my triumph! All around me everything is smiling light and joy! And I'm trembling delightfully from the charming memory of the first day of love!

11. Puccini - 'Si, mi chiamano Mimì' from La bohème

Mimi talks about herself and her dreams to Rodolfo, who has just confessed his love.

Yes, they call me Mimi but my true name is Lucia. My story is short. I embroider canvas or a silk at home and outside... I am happy and at peace and my pastime is to make lilies and roses. I love all things that have gentle sweet smells, that speak of love, of spring, of dreams and fanciful things, those things that have poetic names ... Do you understand me?

They call me Mimi, I do not know why. Alone, I make lunch by myself. I do not go to church, but I pray a lot to the Lord. I stay all alone there in a white room and look upon the roofs and the sky but when the thaw comes The first sun, like my first kiss, is mine! Buds in a vase... Leaf and leaf I spy! That gentle perfume of a flower! But the flowers that I make, Alas! no smell. Other than telling you about me, I know nothina. I am only your neighbor who comes out to bother you at this impossible hour.

MIMÌ (How sweet his praises enter my heart ... Love, you alone rule!) Rodolfo kisses her. No, please!

RODOLFO Tell me.

MIMÌ If I came with you?

Holly Brown (Soprano)

Holly Brown was born in London and studied for her Bachelors and Masters degrees at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, achieving a distinction in both, as well as a diploma for exceptional performance. In 2020 she was contracted as a chorus member to Grange Park Opera for the cancelled season. She joined them again for their 2021 season. Previous stage and operatic experience includes Clorinda in *La Cenerentola* for British Youth Opera, Donna Anna in *Don Giovanni* for the Oxford Alternative Orchestra,

Carolina in *II matrimonio segreto* for Hampstead Garden Opera, the cover of Miranda in *The Enchanted Island* for British Youth Opera, and Pamina in *The Magic Flute* at the Guildhall School. She has worked as a chorus soloist in *Die Entführung aus dem Serail* for West Green House Festival Opera, and played Elaine in Gershwin's *Crazy for You*, alongside members of the Guildhall School's drama department. Other operatic chorus experiences include Judith Weir's *The Vanishing Bridegroom* for British Youth Opera and *The Monster in the Maze*, by Jonathan Dove at Barbican Centre with the LSO and Sir Simon Rattle.

Holly is generously supported in her studies at the Alexander Gibson Opera School by the Countess of Munster Musical Trust and is a Sybil Tutton Opera Award holder.



Andrew Rawlings (Tenor)

Having recently completed his Masters at the Wales International Academy of Voice, Andrew is now at the beginning of his professional singing career. In summer 2021, Andrew joined Opera Loki singing Don José in their production of *Carmen* and will be returning to this role with Opera Brava in Summer 2022. Other roles include the title role in *Candide* (Bernstein), Sempronio (Haydn's *Lo Speziale*), Armed Guard (Mozart's *Magic*

Flute), and Henry Crawford (Jonathon Dove's Mansfield Park).

Andrew has also sung as tenor soloist in numerous oratorios including Mozart's Coronation Mass (St Albans Cathedral), Verdi's Requiem (Arundel Cathedral) and Mendelssohn's *Elijah* (Solihull). He has also featured as a concert soloist at venues such as St David's Hall (Cardiff) and De Montford Hall (Leicester).



David Palmer (Piano)

David Palmer (b. 1997) is a London-based composer and pianist specialising in 20th- and 21st-century repertoire. David studies piano with Ronan O'Hora and Rolf Hind at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, and composition with Richard Barrett. David is a 2022-23 Britten-Pears Young Artist.

David read music at the University of Oxford, graduating with a first-class BA in 2019. He ran the music and chamber music societies, and held multiple scholarships. Before Oxford, David was a composer for the National Youth Orchestra of Great Britain and attended the Junior Royal Northern College of Music. David teaches undergraduate modules at Lady Margaret Hall, Jesus College and Lincoln College of the University of Oxford.

Recent projects include Berg's Kammerkonzert, a solo recital at a festival celebrating the 100th anniversary of TS Eliot's The Waste Land, and various performances with his horn trio and other chamber ensembles.

Ariel

18:00-19:00, 9th and 10th July 2022

A new opera with music by Jonathan Dove and original settings by Jonny Danciger

Ariel, as Shakespeare's most etherial and musical character, has captivated composers throughout history from Henry Purcell to Thomas Adès.

Using some of the latest innovations in live sound technology, this presentation of Ariel's songs and speeches explores how Shakespeare's spirit can break beyond the corporal voice with the tools available to the contemporary composer.

Jonathan Dove's *Songs of Ariel* are interspersed with original settings by Jonny Danciger, as music and soundscape is created live by solo soprano, a microphone and digital effects.



Jonny Danciger (Director, Ariel)

Jonny Danciger is a stage director, composer and designer from South-West London, where he is currently the Artistic Director of the OSO Arts Centre. He read Music at St Peter's College, Oxford, specialising in electroacoustic composition, and trained in opera direction with the Royal Opera House (on Gounod's *Faust*) and British Youth Opera (*Scoring a Century*) assisting Keith Warner. Direction

credits include Cumbria Opera's *Trouble in Tahiti/A Hand of Bridge,* large-scale productions of *Don Giovanni, Candide, Van Gogh* and *Der Diktator*, and world-premieres of operas by Toby Young and Joel Baldwin. Jonny's music for stage has been performed in London, Oxford, Birmingham, Edinburgh & Madrid, and his film composition work includes an advert for charity *Mind.* Jonny has acted professionally under directors Polly Findlay (*Twisted Tales, Lyric Hammersmith*) and Steven Daldry (*Billy Elliot, Victoria Palace Theatre*).



Helsa Townsend (Ariel)

Helsa Townsend is a soprano from Cumbria who graduated from the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire in 2021 with a First Class degree. At the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire Helsa performed the role of Prospero in *The Enchanted Island* and the eponymous role in *Coraline*. Helsa also enjoys song repertoire, having been awarded the Gordon Clinton English Song Prize for Singers, and was a finalist in

the Edward Brooks Lieder Prize, the Conservatoire's Singing Prize and closer to home, the Keldwyth Award. Recently Helsa performed in a series of concerts with the orchestra and company of the Birmingham Royal Ballet, and is delighted to begin work soon on a new piece by Michael Wolters featuring the words of John Amaechi to be performed as part of the 2022 Commonwealth Games. Helsa enjoys music making of all kinds, from choral to solo, from early music to the most contemporary, from classical to jazz and pop, and is thrilled to be joining the team at Cumbria Opera Group once more.
